The Key Statistics report is comprised of overarching fundamental measures of the college, presented in past and present trends. It is a college-wide report consisting of eight sections of statistics: Demographics, Admissions, Enrollment, Financial Assistance to Students, Retention, Graduation and Completion Rates, Faculty, Financial and Professional Development. This report focuses on Clarkson College, the institution.

The Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) is the core postsecondary education data collection program for the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), within the United States Department of Education. IPEDS collects data on postsecondary education in the United States in seven areas: institutional characteristics, institutional prices, enrollment, student financial aid, degrees, and certificates conferred, student persistence and success, and institutional human and fiscal resources. This data is completed in the Fall term of each academic year.

 Clarkson College is a private, accredited, non-profit college in Omaha, NE that was founded in 1888. Clarkson College operates on a semester system offering certificate and degree opportunities in the fields of Nursing, Administration and Management, Community Health, Healthcare Education and Leadership, Health Information Management, Physical Therapist Assistant, Radiography, Medical Imaging, Medical Imaging Informatics, and Professional Development.
